

The Foundation was founded with seven, non-permanent board members and a 1999, end of year treasury balance of \$2,706.

We grew under the leadership of board presidents Judge Christopher Conner, Don Farinelli, Jim Voltz, Steve Butz, Alan Wirt, Dr. Ranny Singiser, Gary Weber, Rich Heeter, John Duggan, Ben Ried, Nathan McWilliams, and current president, Jonathan Boles.

Today, we enjoy a full complement of 21 diverse board members and 2022 year end assets of \$2,719,804 (includes operating funds, designated and undesignated fund!

The Foundation's first grant making year was 2001. Since then, we have awarded nearly \$2 million in program grants that support our MASD learning community, and 43 MASH seniors have received scholarships totaling \$174,050!

With volunteer and donor support, we have completed successful capital campaigns to construct the Trails and Trees Environmental Center, soccer fields and stadium seating at Northside Elementary School, install the first turf field at John H. Frederick Field, and make other, significant improvements to Memorial Park Stadium, including the recently completed Rich Lichtel Field House.
